It is very frustrating to report that on two separate occasions we have had some unwanted visitors in the night. On the first occasion they carefully removed a pane of glass from Scott's office and placed it behind the built-in BBQ, entered the Pro Shop, but took nothing.

On their way to the pro shop they cut CCTV cables as well as the public address system. It was suggested by police that they will be back, and sure enough when staff arrived on the 18th the shop door had been kicked in and three people had picked up the safe and fled.

CCTV footage shows them backing across the practice green, kicking in the door and departing with the safe. The car involved was stolen and Police later found it burnt out at Õreti Beach. The insurance claim will include a new front door, new safe, a new counter and hopefully cover the amount of cash that was stolen. I plan to have a full review of our security system to see what else we can do to deter future burglars. I suspect the answer will be, if they want to get in they will, unless you build a Fort Knox.

I wrote in last month's newsletter (and possibly previous to that) that by the time you read this newsletter the chipping of the logs would have been started. Well, I'm sure this will be the last time I say this. John Hughes has been trying to communicate with the contractor, with little or no response.

As a result he has engaged another contractor, Caldwell Contracting, who were scheduled to start on the March 19.

There will be some inconvenience to golfers over the next week or two as the chip needs to be trucked off the course. Please be careful and stay well away from the area where the contractors are working and trucks that are moving around the course. These contractors will also be doing some stump grinding and once this has been completed the priority is to work the ground and get it sown out in grass seed.

Our architects and engineers are working together, particularly around the design of the new staircase, and once this is completed then Council consent will be applied. We expect this to happen by the end of March.

The new post and rail fence at the entrance to the course is under construction and we hope to have this finished over the next couple of weeks. This will be followed by improving the fencing on the opposite side of the drive to make the entrance to our course more appealing. It is pleasing to see that our membership numbers continue to rise with an overall increase from this time last year of 28.

While there has been a slight drop in Junior golf numbers, the male membership has increased by 31 and the female membership has increased by three.

This makes a total membership of 483. May this trend long continue as this increase could represent an increase in income to the club of \$20k to \$30k pa. With the unforeseen costs mentioned above, this additional income is invaluable. Please continue to promote our golf course and encourage friends and acquaintances to join. The course will only continue to improve as our income provides, so the more members the better the course.
