Golf Tip of the Month

The Chip and Run

Always using your lob wedge for chipping? Maybe there's an easier way! For little chip shots around the green, plan to make the ball bounce about a metre or two past the edge of the green, and choose the club that has the right amount of loft and power to make the ball run to the hole! Often, the "chip and run" style shot is the best way to get consistent results.

<u>Rules & Etiquette</u>

This month's etiquette advice is about speed of play. An 18 hole round of golf, played in a group of four, should take about four hours. That's considered normal speed, and golf is usually played in groups of four. Turn up on a busy day as a group of two, play in a golf cart, and expect to whizz past everyone? Think again. Golfers trying to play too fast are just as much a nuisance as those who play too slowly. Two hours for 9 holes, four hours for 18 – pace yourselves, be patient, and be courteous to others.
